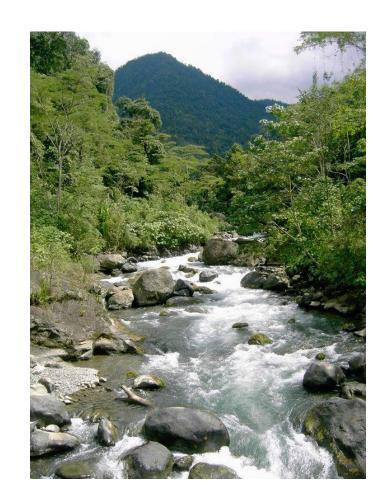
Core Values

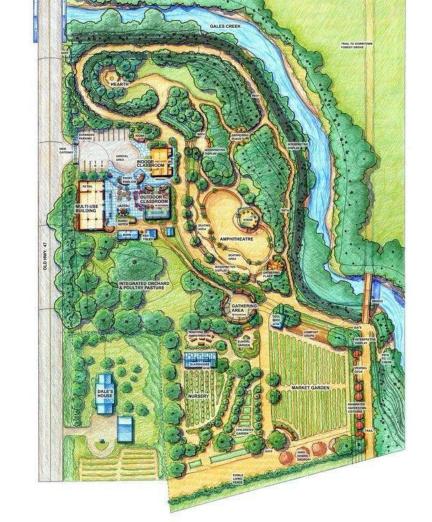
